



COVID-19 ACTION CHART

REVISED (NOV. 2020)

Less Common Symptoms

Sore throat, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, chills, muscle pain, fatigue, headache, runny nose



Evaluate symptoms and determine if the child is well enough to attend or remain at school.

Remain at home or send home and consider evaluation from a health care provider and/or COVID-19 test.

Return to school after 24 hours with no symptoms and fever, without the use of fever-reducing medications.

*Siblings do not need to stay at home or quarantine.

Case-by-Case
Final decision may depend on doctor's recommendations, the number of symptoms, and other situation-specific factors. Your child may have to stay at home for longer than 24 hours.



Common Symptoms

Fever ($\geq 37.5^{\circ}\text{C}$), continuous cough, difficulty breathing, loss of taste or smell

Child is well enough to attend or remain in school.

Evaluation and/or COVID-19 test from a health care provider.

Child and/or household contact receive an **alternative diagnosis** OR a **negative COVID-19** test result.

Child and household contacts remain at home or are sent home.

*If the child and/or household contacts take a COVID-19 test, they must stay at home until the results are known.

*Ask the doctor about when it is safe for your children to return to school.



IF POSITIVE

Does not seek evaluation and/or COVID-19 test from a health care provider.

Stay at home for at least 7 days from the time the symptoms started, plus at least 3 additional days without symptoms before returning.

In the event of a positive COVID result, we will consult with the local health authorities for immediate guidance.

We require families to report any and all overseas travel to our front office, and self-isolate for 14 days.

Staying Informed

Families must confirm with the office before sending their child back to school.



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What will happen if COVID is discovered within the KAIS community?

In the event of a positive COVID-19 result, we will...

- consult with the local health authorities for immediate guidance.
- inform the KAIS community.
- consider campus closure and a temporary move to distance learning.
- thoroughly clean and disinfect the school.

What will happen if my child (or a household contact) is identified as a "close contact" of COVID-19?

If you or a member of your household is identified as a close contact of COVID-19, then...

- your child and household contacts should remain at home.
- seek out a PCR test, for which you may be eligible. Your child and household members must stay at home until the PCR test results are known.
 - if you tested positive, follow the directions of the health authorities and stay at home for 14 days.
 - if you tested negative, your child is safe to return to school.
 - if you are not eligible for a PCR test, stay at home for 14 days.
